Submission Types:

- (1) Completed Research Papers - Regular full-length papers will be welcome in technical and behavioral IS research. The conference welcomes theoretical essays, formal analyses, technical discussions, and reports of quantitative or qualitative empirical research. The program committee will be asked to choose among papers strictly on the basis of quality.
- (2) Research-in-Progress (RIP) - RIP papers typically represent work that is incomplete, but promising. As in ICIS 2007 and 2008, RIP papers will be presented in an interactive format as posters and will appear in the Proceedings.
- (3) Panels – Panels sessions bring together researchers with complementary or conflicting perspectives on a research topics or another issue of importance to the IS field. Proposals should be submitted through the Panels track.
- (4) Teaching Cases – Teaching cases are immensely useful to the field as the source of pedagogical materials that students find exciting and thoughtful. Teaching Cases should be submitted to the IS Curriculum and Education track.
